Sebastes vexillaris: 2 ad., caught
close together, differing greatly in
color when fresh. The smaller one
is almost entirely reddish, ~~translucent~~
deep red on all the fins except toward
the sooty blue borders. The larger one
is brown grading toward salmon and
yellow brown in blotches and with a
very distinct lemon-yellow ~~spot~~ spot
on either side of D. origin and a
large oblique bar ~~on~~ extending from
near front of lateral line downward
and backward. The fins are reddish

but not nearly so red as in the smaller specimen and the dark borders are much weaker. On the posterior $\frac{2}{3}$ of the sides, especially below the lateral line, the smaller specimen has numerous very distinct triangular blackish spots with a straight and vertical posterior edge. The smaller specimen lacks the yellow spot near front of D. and shows only a trace of the oblique bars. It does however have like the larger one considerable yellow on the opercle and in 2 streaks extending downward and backward from eye.
