at surface under light; wiggly;  
at times ~~made~~ floated as a  
circle with head in contact with  
candel. Only fish seen ~~at~~ floating  
under light, except 1 Hypsoblennius

40. Atherinops affinis, juv. caerulescens  
abundant, mostly deep, rarely  
rising to surface, feeding a  
little on crustacea, a few  
caught before & after our collecting.  
Preyed on by squids - many of which

show silvery due to fish inside.
