These fish were collected very close to shore in very shallow water. Mr. Hussong states that they are the same fish that spawn on the beach, and that they had spawned just a few days previously. Some were taken then on the beach - but spoiled before being preserved. He described the spawning - the ♀ digging in and the ♂ coiling around.

These fish much prized by local residents as food. They are collected by spear & throw net - since they escape from beach so rapidly. Known as Chaca-Reys (spelling a guess).
