Trachurus hypoclinemus : 1 yr.

Definitely golden in life with strong green-blue iridescence above and silver below.

47A) Hyperproasopon ^{argenteum} ~~subellum~~ : 3 ad. (162-187)

Seems definitely thicker, especially in head and head is blunter than in argenteum. Back darker. Pelvic fins with much more black. Underlying color dark blackish blue. There is a strong suffusion of coppery red on sides, more largely to dark spots on bases. Fleshier parts of face, especially around eye and preopercular margin golden-orange. Much amber in upper part of eye. Some reddish amber on fins. One specimen had quite a number of argulus-like parasites. Parasites saved.
