Color note on Radulinus by C.L.H.

Ground color finely reticulated with bluish gray and golden brown, with large greenish brown blotch on nape becoming golden just before the pencilled bluish brown posterior border. Two diamond shaped blotches under 2nd dorsal, largely pink-lavender, greenish brown inside anterior and posterior angles. The saddles also with a brownish black marginal line along which the ground color is abruptly lightened. Upper surface of lip red becoming greenish cream just in advance of brown-black mark before base of caudal. Considerable
