54. *Anoplogoma fimbria* (Pallas) JUN 19 1952

George Wernham reports seeing this fish in the small pier aquarium on the Oceanside pier. It had been caught this morning by the proprietor of the bait and tackle shop on the pier. He noted the large dorsal fin separated into two parts, forked caudal, straight lateral line, blackish-silvery color, etc. He checked it with figures of parrotfish. Estimated length 7 inches. Bait man would not give fish to Wernham for S.I.O., but said he would take it to Terminal Island. Proprietor of sportfish business (McCulloch?) says, in phone, he'd keep fresh the fish if it dies. He will not release it.
