Color note: When brought in had usual colors, olive above and silvery below with yellow stripe and upper lobe of caudal golden yellow. After being kept for a time very strong pink, irregularly bifurcating, developed. Bars almost black with cream interspaces. Suddenly while being held in hands fish changed back to original color.

About 1700 2 large sharks around
Orca, hooked one, ab. 8' long.

Observed carefully by CLH while
attempting to land him. Finally
broke line. 9 dent. as almost surely

Carcharhinus lamnoides

About 30 minutes later a second shark
hooked and landed. Series of measurements
taken. Jaws section of vertebrae and piece
of skin dried. Parasites collected by C. G.
Alexander. 2 ray spines found in jaws.

Heads of yellow tail and bass thrown over
from Orca in stomach of shark.
