Frank Almon checks the log of the "Southland"
for the trip preceding X1:27:1955 and finds that
bait was made 12 times, 9 times in
Bahia Santa Maria, twice at San Hipolito
and once at Coles Colnett. The "Bank"
on one label, no doubt refers to the
place of fishing; the specimen was
definitely reported as from a bait-net,
hence the locality as given.
Specimen now changed to isopropyl alcohol. S.L.H.
